

Shifting back to in-person gatherings

Being innovative with the "new" business environment and ever-changing business climate

NOTABLES FOR 2021

- Celebrated the 75th anniversary of the Chamber, incorporated in 1946.
- In-person events saw a resurgence with General Membership Luncheons rebounding to 85% of pre-pandemic attendance.
- Retirement of Kathy Gillette, President/CEO 2014-2019, Membership 2006-2013.
- Promotion of Kim Brown to President/CEO 2020-Present, Development 2014-2019.
- First Membership Campaign since 2008. Hosted over 120 volunteers and gained 141 new members.
- Welcomed new staff person, Kelly Arnold, APR, to the role of Director of Development and Engagement.
- Hosted Leadership Moore classes 2020-2021 and 2021-2022, introducing over 30
 community leaders to the program and a variety of aspects of the community.
- Held Inaugural Day at the Capitol in partnership with Rep. Mark McBride. More than 20 attendees heard from the Oklahoma Governor, Speaker of the House, Chairman of Appropriations and Budget, Director of the Unemployment Commission, and more.
- Networking Lunches were re-vamped to be hosted at local member restaurants
 as a way to continue to support the efforts of rebounding establishments and to
 accommodate the size of the event which has outgrown the Chamber facility.
- Fill the Bus We delivered \$300-\$350 worth of school supplies to 20 Moore
 Public Schools totaling over \$6,700. We received \$2,750 in Fill the Bus
 sponsorship money to purchase the remaining school supplies. Overall, we
 received over 3,700 pieces of school supplies.
- Women's Impact Network (WIN) has grown to over 70 active participants and again contributed \$1,000 to their community partner - Women's Resource Center.
- WIN held its first "Girl Boss" Luncheon with over 120 in attendance and a panel of four professional and influential women leaders.
- Hosted seven strategic planning sessions with Chamber members and members of the community to help direct the future of the Chamber.
- Began production of Member Moment videos, a series of video highlights sponsored monthly by a member, who then selects four fellow members to spotlight in the videos.
- Improving on the social media platforms, the Chamber now has a Linkedin page to provide another connection point for member professionals.
